Keeping on winning and getting their shear

Four of New Zealand's most in-form shearers continued on their winning ways as the 2017-2018 shearing sports season started drawing to a close at the weekend.

Thery were headed by three Golden Shears champions Rowland Smith, of Hastings, and Tegwyn Bradley, of Woodville, who won the Open and Senior titles respectively at the Waitomo Caves Sports in the King Country on Saturday, and Brandon Maguire-Ratima, of Winton, who won the Intermediate final at the Flaxbourne A and P Show on Sunday.

Woodville shearer Daniel Seed, who was fourth to Maguire-Ratima at the Golden Shears, won Saturday's Waitomo Intermediate final.

Smith's win was his 20th of the season, Bradley has had 12 wins, and Maguire-Ratima and Seed have each won 10 finals this season.

The Junior final at Waitomo was won by finals newcomer Jade Kingi.

It was also at Ward that local product and 2012 PGG Wrightsoin National Circuit winner Angus Moore won his 10th Open title in the 11 seasons since he won the Golden Shears Senior title in 2007. Despite being only third to finish Moore a four-man final of 13 sheep each, Moore won by more than 12 points from runner-up Earl Paewai.

It was Moore's third Flaxmbourne show Open win, and helped christen a new shearing pavilion built to replace the previous facilities which were badly damaged in the Kaikoura earthquake 17 months earlier.

Winner of four Intermediate finals earlier in the season, Duncan Higgins, from Havelock, stepped-up to win his first Senior title, beating sister Sarah Higgins by just 0.21pts.

There are three shearing sports competitions at Easter, including a Royal Easter Show woolhandling competition in Auckland for the first time, and in the South Island shearing-only competitions at the Oxford A and P Show and the Mackenzie Shears' national lambshearing championships at Fairlie.

The New Zealand Shears end the season in Te Kuiti on April 5-7.
