OFFICIAL RULES FOR SHEARING, WOOLHANDLING AND WOOL PRESSING JUDGES:

- A prospective judge must be approved by a Shearing or Woolhandling Examiner. An official badge will be issued when the examiner is satisfied that the judge has served an adequate probationary period.
- To remain on the list a judge must judge at one competition annually and endeavor to attend a judge's day annually.
- 3. All judges must be certified, competent to judge all relevant skills and be given the opportunity to judge a trial sheep/pen/fleece before the competition commences.
- Judges must report to competitions 30 minutes before the commencement of the first event.
- 5. Judges must be tidily dressed and wear their official badge.
- Judges will refrain from alcohol until their judging duties for the day are completed.
- Judges are not permitted to smoke while carrying out their judging duties.
- Judges must be conversant with all rules in the current competition directory.
- 9. Judges must rotate so that all competitors receive equal scrutiny.
- 10.Judges will refrain from walking behind the down tube or returning back along the shearing board while shearers are competing.
- 11.Referees to be available on board before each heat starts and the referees should be easily identifiable.
- 12. Written complaints regarding the performance of a judge will be handled by the local examiner, in consultation with SSNZ executive. If they all agree the judge has not given reasonable satisfaction the judge will be informed and be given the right to appeal to SSNZ. The national committee will make the final decision as to whether the judge should be removed from or remain on the list.

Super shear—Combs & Cuttters

COMPETITION RULES:

- 1. A referee will be appointed for each competition i.e. Shearing, woolhandling or pressing.
- A judge has the right to stop any competitor whose work or conduct on the board is detrimental to the image of Competition shearing, woolhandling or pressing.
- It is to be at the discretion of the judge, if blood from a competitor's wound is visible, to have the right to stop that competitor.
- 4. Approved Hand Held Counters may be used at contests.
- Competitors have the right to reject any substandard sheep/ fleece before shearing commences, provided the referee agrees.
 - a. For National Titles, semi finals must be held in all events where the total number of heat entries equals or exceeds four times the number of stands available. Where the heat entries equal or exceeds 8 times the number of stands used, a quarter final will be held, e.g. at a 4 stand competition, 16 or more competitors warrant a semi-final, 32 competitors warrant a quarter final. This is recommended for all competitions.
- Heats and stands will be drawn prior to the start of the events. Finalists shall draw for stands as they take the board.
- No unauthorised holder is permitted in the catching pen. and no officials are permitted to assist a competitor in any way except where safety is concerned. (refer rule 24)
- 8. Late entries may be accepted at up to a surcharge of 50%.
- Competitors in competitions must be suitably attired and this will include footwear (i.e. jandals or open sandals and caps or hats are prohibited). The referee will administer this ruling.

- 10. Any competitor who is not present for the presentation of prizes will not receive the prize unless reasonable grounds for being absent are represented to the organising Committee before the prize giving.
- 11. Competitors must be suitably attired for prize giving.
- 12. Competitors may judge at a contest where they are competing, but not in the class in which they are competing.
- 13. Competitor's points for any titles such as the South Island Shearer of the year or any circuit events where points are accumulated will not be taken from societies not affiliated to Shearing Sports NZ Inc.
- 14. Any disputes will be taken to a disputes committee of which the referees shall be Chairman. A written protest must be lodged within 15 minutes of posting the results for an event. Any unresolved dispute must be forwarded in writing, first to the committee concerned and finally, if necessary to SSNZ National committee.
- 15. In any tie the highest quality points wins.
- All contests must be equipped with needle, thread and antiseptic.
- 17. At the referees discretion competitors may compete in more than one class, but can only progress through, semi-finals or finals in one division
- 18. One spare stopwatch and timekeeper will be available to time any stoppages and if necessary these will be deducted from the competitor's total time.
- The use of drugs, drips or oxygen are banned in all competitions.
- 20. All competitors compete at their own risk.

- 21. At all competitions random drug tests may be required.
 - First offence of positive test, stand down period of 5 competitions. For reinstatement a competitor must submit a clear test, at their expense. This will be compulsory.
 - Second offence, competitor will be banned from competing for a full competition season, for reinstatement, competitor must submit a clear test, at their expense. This will be compulsory.
- 22. Any inappropriate action by a competitor that brings competition into disrepute may result in a disciplinary action by the contest's disputes committee or if necessary by SSNZ Inc. Disciplinary action may include suspension from future events for up to 30 competition days.
- 23. Shearers will be allowed two loaded hand pieces. No time will be allowed for stoppages caused by gear, hand pieces or sheep getting away from the shearer on the board. A time allowance or re-run may be considered at the referees/committees decision if any stoppage is caused through another competitors sheep escaping or a fault occurring with the machine or down tube. (Exception—3 hand pieces permitted for 3 or more breeds)
- 24. An authorized holder is permitted in the catching pen. This person may not tip or lift sheep for the competitor. No unauthorized persons are permitted in the catching pen and no officials are allowed to assist a competitor in any way, except where safety is a concern Each Shearer must:
 - a. Start and stop their own machine
 - b. Open pen door and collect their sheep from standing Position within the catching pen, except where a ruling has been made prior to the event for safety reasons.
 (e.g. Scottish Blackface, where sheep may be held in a sitting position).
 - c. Put each sheep out the porthole after shearing.
 - d. Switch their hand piece off between sheep.

- 25. Preparation of competition sheep must be kept to a uniform standard to ensure the safety of teats and vulva.
- 26. Competitors may not present their own sheep for out side judges, but may be required to present sheep from other heats or competitors and will be disqualified from the competition for failing to do so.
- Quality Benchmark: A quality benchmark applies and will be over 15 on the board and;
 - a. Over 15 for Crossbred/Strong Wool sheep in the pen
 - b. Over 25 for Merino/Fine wool sheep in the pen
 - Quality Benchmark maybe extended at the discretion of the Disputes Committee.

Competitors with quality points who exceed the benchmark will be placed in ascending order BELOW those competitors who do not exceed the benchmark (NOVICE EXCLUDED)

Competitors who exceed the benchmark can still receive prize money/product

- 28. Each shearer will have a separate timekeeper with a stopwatch or other suitable timing device and time will be taken from "GO" until the machine is switched off after completing final sheep. Where electronic timing is being used, it is the shearer's responsibility to stop their time. Shearer's must wait on the board with one hand on the closed door to wait for "GO".
- 29. Woolhandlers are not permitted on the shearing board.
- 30. No oddment piles are allowed on the board.
- 31. All woolhandling finals must use competent resident shearer's (also for heats when possible) who must complete the event and stay on the assigned stand.
- In full wool competitions, there will no skirting of first pieces on the board.
- 33. Where the outside referee is called upon in International Test and NZ Team selection, the final decision will be made in consultation with the Chief Referee.

SHEARING PENALTIES

- 1. One penalty stroke for not throwing the belly clear.
- 2. One penalty stroke for a cleared belly where it interferes with another competitor.
- Up to 2 strokes for obvious belly or brisket wool not removed, including side fringes.
- 4. a. One penalty stroke for not breaking the neck wool.
 - One penalty stroke for deliberately breaking of the fleece on the first hind leg.
- Blade Shearing: Cutting out the neck will be penalised by three strokes.
- Up to two penalty strokes per leg for failing to remove socks. With a maximum of four at referees discretion.
- 7. Flesh cuts will incur a minimum of five strokes.
- 8. A competitor is automatically penalized by the addition of 5 whole points per offence added to their normal penalties on which they:
 - a. Cut a teat and impair the breeding ability of the ewe
 - b. Cuts and seriously damages the pizzle on a wether
 - c. Cut a hamstring
 - d. Cuts any sheep to the extent that it requires surgical attention

Five penalty strokes multiplied by the number of sheep shorn.

- (referee may require a minor cut to be stitched without imposing the above penalty).
- Five whole points will be imposed by the referee after consultation with the judge for rough handling of the sheep per offence.
- 10. Five whole penalty points per offence for plucking sheep before and after time (by shearer or pen assistant).

SHEARING PENALTIEScont

- 11. Five penalty strokes per offence for allowing a shorn or partly shorn sheep to escape. The shearer must make a genuine effort to pen the sheep, does not apply if sheep is properly penned and returns to the board.
- 12. Two penalty strokes, if pen handler lifts sheep to assist catch. (refer rule 24)

SHEARING POINTS CALCULATION

Time Points:

One penalty for each 20 seconds, multiply minutes by 3,

divide seconds by 20

Board Penalties:

Divide judges strokes by sheep shorn

Pen:

Divide averaged judges strokes by sheep shorn

Results:

Add time penalty to board and pen penalties to get total.

Least Penalties wins.

BLENDING RULE

That lambs wool and second shear wools are to be well-blended fleece into fleece. Blending will be judged once at the end prior to the competitor signaling time. A maximum of 20 points for no blend.

WOOLHANDLING TIME POINTS

Time penalties will calculated at the rate of 5 seconds per point to the following standard times. The standard times will be set at the referees/committees discretion.

Merino Wool:

- 1 Shearer within the range of 3 to 3.30 minutes
- 2 Shearer's up to 25% more of time set

Mid Micron and Crossbred Full Wool

- 1 Shearer within the range of 2 to 2.30 minutes
- 2 Shearer's up to 25% more of time set

WOOLHANDLING TIME POINTS....cont

2nd Shear and Lambs

Between the range of 40 seconds to 1 minute

Competitors exceeding the standard time limit will be penalised at the rate of 1 point per second thereafter.

Teams Event:

A team will be made up of two shearer's and two woolhandler's. Each team will shear and handle the wool from a minimum of six sheep

Shearer's are not allowed to assist woolhandler's with woolhandling.

Woolhandler's can assist each other on the board or table when time permits.

Shearer's may shear an uneven number of sheep.

TEAM POINTS

The shearer's points shall be left as actual penalty points and not divided by the number of sheep shorn.

The woolhandler's board, oddments and fleece points will be added together and then divided by 2.5.

One time will be taken for each team—from "GO" to the Woolhandler raising the broom at the rate of 10 secs/point.

NOTE: There will be occasions where the level of fault present in the wool means the woolhandler's points will be too high in relation to the shearer and time points. The woolhandling referee has the right to adjust the dividing factor on the woolhandler's points to a figure higher than 2.5. This figure should rarely exceed 4.0.

WOOL PRESSING COMPETITIONS

Competitors will be judged on their wool pressing skills in the following categories.

1. Setting up the Press:

Inserting pins

Checking wool pack for loose fibre

Fitting wool pack into press

Team work

Use of safety catches (door, top box, winch and press handle).

2. Loading press with wool

Tramping technique

Loading wool into press, lifting technique, efficiency and tidiness

Bales should be tramped to ensure bottom box is heavier than top box

Placing lid into position on top box (lid must not be above walls of top box)

3. Pressing bale (pulling the loaded press down)

Lifting and lowering top box into position, use of safety catches and lifting technique

Removal of pins from top box

Fitting pull down bars to lid and connecting ropes to capstan

Pressing technique while pulling the press down

Inserting side pinning assemblies. Handle taken off when pressing bale

Releasing the press and removing the lid, technique and safety Removing ropes from capstan.

4. Capping off the bale

Amount of wool exposed above pins

Folding flaps into position, removal and replacement of pack holders

Inserting bale clips, top and bottom flaps

Flaps must overlap 100mm

Position and spacing of bale clips Correct use of bale hook

Remove side pinners, storing handle

Removing bale from press

Opening door: lifting & bale handling technique; closing press door, refitting safety catch

5. Completed bale

Overall tidiness

Amount of wool exposed from top or corners of bale Top corners of flaps should fit snugly over bottom flaps Bottom corners should be equally firm

Bale should stand square on floor

6. Farm brand and bale description

Competitors must show where the farm brand, bale number and wool description should be placed Describe the wool category, i.e fleece, second shear, 1st lambs etc as well as know the standard industry description

(FLC, 2/S, 1ST LBS). (The bale description should be written on the judges score sheet by the competitors).

7. Final clean up and tidiness

The floor area around the press and wool bins must be clean and tidy

Press pins should be relocated into bottom of top box Press ropes should be folded/coiled neatly on the floor beside pull down bars

Pack holders should be replaced in position

8. Bale Weight

Competitors will be advised the target bale weight by supervising judge

Competitors are not allowed to see bale weights until heats are completed. Penalties will be 1 point for each kg plus or minus 15kg from target weight, and 2 points for weights over 15kg from target weight.

9. Time Points

Time points will be calculated at one point every 10 seconds

10. Personal Safety

Judges will penalise careless workmanship and rough use of equipment and facilities in the interests of safety.

- The challenger must accept full responsibility for all travel and accommodation costs for its own team members.
- The defender shall provide a four stand venue and all officials necessary for the challenge, as well as adult sheep of one breed.
- The defender and challenger must take into account due respect for the Tru Test Ltd / Supershear brand when organising any sponsorship for the challenge.
- 7. The teams will consist of 1 open and 1 senior shearer 1 open and 1 junior woolhandler.
- 8. The challenging team can have one shearing judge and one woolhandling judge at the invitation of the defenders.

- 14. Should the trophy be uplifted at any stage the remaining number of challenges available can be reapplied for by giving two weeks notice to the new defender. All previously accepted challenges shall have first option.

- Affiliated Speed Shears must use registered SSNZ judges. SSNZ judges are permitted to judge at nonaffiliated Speed Shears, but should encourage them to be affiliated to SSNZ.
- Judges and officials have the right to refuse a competitor, if it is considered their ability is impaired by alcohol or drugs.
- Open and Senior grade Speed Shears only. If a Speed Shear wishes to involve Junior and Intermediate grades, it must be a clean shear event.
- SSNZ Health & Safety policy will apply to Speed Shear events.
- In fairness to competitors every effort should be made to get lambs/sheep as even as possible.

SPEED SHEAR RULES:

- Sheep to be judged standing (unless an obvious misdemeanor underneath) to a pen score of 15 and under. Above15 is a red light.
- 2. Plucking after time will mean disqualification.
- Time to be taken from cord pull to cord pull if electronic timing is not available
- 4. No false starts (applicable to timing system only)
- 5. Moccasins or suitable footwear must be worn
- 6. Full pizzle, teat and tail crutch is essential.

CHECKLIST FOR SHEARING & WOOLHANDLING COMMITTEES:

As a quick guide here is a checklist of the people and roles important for a smooth running competition:

- Schairman responsible for coordination, program, presentations and gathering together a good team.
- Secretary: Entries, results to Doug, cash prizes, judging stationary, judges etc.
- ⇒ Publicity Officer: Doug! Use him, he's great value.
- Sheep Steward: responsible for securing the sheep, good preparation and selection for finals. Transport, unloading and loading, and any animal welfare issues.
- Sheep Steward: responsible for securing the sheep, good preparation and selection for finals. Transport, unloading and loading and any animal welfare issues.
- Pen Steward: to ensure enough pen staff for the stock movement of shorn & woolly sheep—works closely with the sheep steward.
- Wool Steward: ring the wool examiner for help here—wool containers, wool movers, stop watches. Pressing requirements with fadges, clips etc. A good wool judging area with tables and fadge holders. Press and presser.
- Points Person: very important, computer generated results are always the best, but so are accurate manual points people. Copies of points for the finalists are always appreciated.
- Presentation Steward: someone who knows what all goes together such as product, cash and ribbons—not an easy job. Nice to have a well laid table and a prepared presentation steward to ensure the presentation goes off well.

Committee Checklist....cont

- Catering: nothing goes well without good food for the hard working crew. This includes cold drinks for those hot day.
- Draws Steward: This person will ensure the draws are made in a timely manner and will then attend to the blackboards with names clearly and correctly written.
- Commentator: someone to ensure the day moves along and can keep the layperson informed as to what is going on. Also important in keeping our sponsors in front of the people.
- Disputes Committee: not often this is needed, but you do need to be aware of who forms the make up of this body (Shearer / Woolhandler Rep).
- One last tip, it's always helpful if the committee are conversant with the Directory—90% of the answers are at your fingertips, if not give you Regional Delegate a call, only to pleased to offer support.
- All A-grade Crossbred open shearing shows to run 10 sheep semi-final and other shows to run a minimum of 8 sheep semi-final where practical.

PROGRAMME TIPS:

A professional image and presentation is important for the survival of our sport. Plan you competition with careful attention to detail so that you start on time and stay on time.

Understand that finals are the finale for the day, they deserve to be in prime time, think about the best timing for these events.

A sponsor who can appear in front of an enthusiastic crowd, will definitely want to be there again next year.

So our hot tips are:

- ⇒ Have a timetable, and be committed to sticking with it.
- ⇒ Promote your show at preceding shows, especially the start time.
- ⇒ Organise to have plenty of help.
- ⇒ It's not your fault if people are late—the late junior shearer will just have to shear in the intermediate class!
- ⇒ Aim to run the major finals at prime time 3pm-4pm. This is just before people start leaving for home.
- ⇒ Schedule events to minimize delays.
- ⇒ Keep the pace 'hot', a good commentator can help this.
- ⇒ Be just as careful in your planning for the prize giving as for the actual shearing and woolhandling events. A lack of planning at the prize giving can cancel all the good work early on.
- ⇒ **Public Liability** all competitions are urged to check their public liability responsibilities and cover.

SSNZ encourages all show committees to promote their events through the media, if this is an issue, let Doug help you.

Often a good idea to have someone who has this as a dedicated responsibility.

Finally, please remember to get those results to Doug asap, after your competition.

- * 80% majority required in secret ballot at the SSNZ AGM.
