# OFFICIAL RULES FOR SHEARING, WOOLHANDLING AND WOOL PRESSING JUDGES:

- A prospective judge must be approved by a Shearing or Woolhandling Examiner. An official badge will be issued when the examiner is satisfied that the judge has served an adequate probationary period.
- 2. To remain on the list a judge must judge at one competition annually and endeavor to attend a judge's day annually.
- All judges must be certified, competent to judge all relevant skills and be given the opportunity to judge a trial sheep/ pen/fleece before the competition commences.
- Judges must report to competitions 30 minutes before the commencement of the first event.
- 5. Judges must be tidily dressed and wear their official badge.
- Judges will refrain from alcohol until their judging duties for the day are completed.
- Judges are not permitted to smoke while carrying out their judging duties.
- 8. Judges must be conversant with all rules in the current competition directory.
- Judges must rotate so that all competitors receive equal scrutiny.
- 10.Judges will refrain from walking behind the down tube or returning back along the shearing board while shearers are competing.
- 11.Referees to be available on board before each heat starts and the referees should be easily identifiable.
- 12. Written complaints regarding the performance of a judge will be handled by the local examiner, in consultation with SSNZ executive. If they all agree the judge has not given reasonable satisfaction the judge will be informed and be given the right to appeal to SSNZ. The national committee will make the final decision as to whether the judge should be removed from or remain on the list.

#### **COMPETITION RULES:**

**NB:** Any additions to these rulings in <u>italics</u> are NZ country Specific. Also those marked with # relate to Woolhandling.

#### 1. COMPETITORS:

- (a) # Competitors enter and compete at their own risks.
- (b) # Competitors must be suitably dressed, including footwear. The Referee will administer this ruling. They must be suitably dressed for the Presentation ceremony. Any competitor who is not present for the presentation of prizes will not receive the prize unless reasonable grounds for being absent are presented to the organizing committee before prize giving.
- (c) # The use of drugs, intravenous fluids or oxygen is banned in all competitions. Random drug tests maybe taken, and if proved positive, the competitor will pay all costs and be disqualified.
  - (i) First offence of positive test, stand down period of 5 competitions. For reinstatement a competitor must submit a clear test, at their expense. This will be compulsory.
  - (ii) Second offence, competitor will be banned from competing for a full competition season, for reinstatement, competitor must submit a clear test, at their expense. This will be compulsory.
- (d) The referee or judge has the right to switch off the machine or disqualify any competitor whose work or conduct on the shearing board is detrimental to the image of competition shearing, woolhandling or pressing. Referee may stop a competitor during an event if clearly not competitive time wise. (See <u>6.</u> (f) also)

- (e) # Any inappropriate action by a competitor that brings a competition into disrepute may result in a disciplinary action by the contest's disputes committee or if necessary by SSNZ Inc. Disciplinary action may include suspension from future events for up to 30 competition days.
  - (f) # Competitors may judge (if a registered SSNZ judge) at a contest where they are competing, but not in the class in which they are participating.

#### 2. COMPETITION RULES

- (a) # A draw for heats will be made prior to all competitions. Finalists shall draw for stands as they take the board.
- (b) Competitors must provide their own hand-pieces, combs, cutters and blade shears. Sharpening equipment will be made available by the Host committee in accordance with local regulations or laws.
- (c) Competitors will each be allowed two loaded hand -pieces or two blade shears which are their responsibility and no time will be allowed for stoppage caused by their hand-piece, blade shears, or sheep escaping from the competitor on the shearing board. Should any stoppages occur through the fault of the machine or through another competitor's sheep escaping, a time allowance will be made or a re-run given, only at the Board Referee and Chief Referee's discretion. The organizing Committee may allow competitors to use up to three hand-pieces in multiple breed/ wool type events.

#### **COMPETITION RULES Cont...**

- (d) A draw for stands must be made after sheep are in the catching pens for all quarter-finals, semifinals, finals and where practical for heats. In the case of a left- handed machine shearer, that competitor's sheep will be moved to left-hand stand if one is available
- (e) Competitors may enter their pen in the presence of a Judge, to sort and inspect their sheep. Plucking of wool before and/or after time (during if by pen assistant) will incur a penalty. (See <u>7.</u> (k)). [One whole point per of fence for work before or after time by competitor or pen handler (and during by pen handler) for plucking, removing tassels etc. To be imposed by board referee in consultation with Judge/s,]
- (f) Competitors may appeal to the Referee to have any sheep they consider sub-standard replaced before the heat, quarter, semi-final or final commences. The Referee's decision is final. Any sheep rejected by the Referee must be raddled/ marked and with drawn from the entire event.
- (g) Without assistance each competitor must:
  - (i) Start and stop their machine.
  - (ii) Collect their sheep from a standing position within the catching pen, except where a ruling has been made prior to the event for safety reasons. (e.g. Scottish Blackface, where sheep may be held in a sitting position.)
  - (iii) Put each sheep out the porthole after shearing.
  - (iv) Switch their hand-piece off between sheep.

- (h) An authorized holder is permitted in the catching pen. This person may not tip or lift the sheep for the competitor or switch the machine on or off. No unauthorized persons are permitted in the catching pen and no officials are allowed to assist a competitor in anyway, except where safety is a concern. (See 2. (g) (ii) and 7. c).
- (i) Competitors must wait on the board and may place hand/s on the closed door/s to await the word 'GO' from the Starter
- On completion of shearing their sheep, all competitors will remain on their stand until the last competitor has finished, unless;
  - (i) They need to seek urgent medical attention.
  - (ii) They have been granted permission to leave the board by the referee prior to the commencement of such heat or final.
- (k) Competitors may not present their own sheep for the Pen Judges, but may be required to present from the next heat. Failure to do so when required will result in a penalty of one whole point from the Pen Referee.
- (I) At the Chief Referee's discretion, competitors may compete in more than one class, but can only progress through semi-finals or finals in one division.
- (m) For National Titles, semi-finals must be held in all events, where the total number of heat entries exceeds four times the number of stands available. Where the heat entries equal or exceeds 8 times the number of stands used, a quarter-final will be held, e.g. at a 4 stand competition, 16 or more competitors warrant a semi-final, 32 competitors warrant a quarter-final. This is recommended for all competitions.

#### **COMPETITION RULES ...cont**

(n) Competitor's points for any titles such as South Island Shearer of the Year or any circuit event where points are accumulated will not be taken from societies not affiliated to SSNZ Inc.

#### 3. SHEEP

- Sheep chosen must be carefully selected for evenness of type and size to provide a fair competition.
- (b) Preparation of competition sheep must be kept to a minimum with uniform standard to ensure the safety of pizzle, teats and vulva.

#### 4. TIMING

- (a) # A competition will provide a separate timekeeper with a stopwatch or an approved self-timing device for each competitor. Back up stop watch timing is recommended for self-timing devices.
- (b) Each competitor's time will be taken from the Starter's 'GO' until......
  - Machine shearers have completed their final sheep and switched off their hand-piece or the 'Stop' button is pushed.
  - (ii) Blade shearers have completed their final sheep and put their shears down or the 'Stop' button is pushed.

#### 5. REFEREES

- (a) # A Chief Referee will be appointed for each competition who will be responsible for the administration and Control of the competition strictly according to these International Rules, and any additional rules approved by World Council. The Chief Referee's ruling on any matter not covered by the above will be final.
  - (b) # Any person may seek clarification on any point from the referee. The referee may rule on the matter raised or refer it to the Disputes

    Committee
  - (c) The referee must be called and decided any whole point penalty as in <u>2.</u> (k), <u>7.</u> (k) and <u>9.(b)</u>.
  - (d) Before the start of the competition the Chief Referee will announce whether 'socks' are to be taken off or left on, clarify where crutching starts and finishes, and signify any penalty to be applied accordingly (See 9. (a) (iv)).
  - (e) # Where the outside referee is called upon in International Tests and NZ Team selection, the final decision will be made in consultation with the Chief Referee.

#### **SHEARING PENALTIES**

#### 6. BOARD JUDGES:

- (a) The board judges will judge for:
  - (i) Second cutting of the wool
  - (ii) Breaking of fleece
  - (iii) Work before or after time
  - (iv) Other penalties as per rule 7.
- (b) Board judges must start on the same stand in each heat Quarter or semi-final of an event.
- (c) Board Judge's must rotate so that all competitors Receive equal scrutiny.
- (e) Board Judges using counters must, at completion of last sheep of each heat or final, record every competitor's penalty strokes on card provided.
- (f) If a competitor receives an injury causing serious bleeding, the Board Judge will stop the competitor if he believes it is in the best interest of the competitor or the competition to do so.

#### 7. BOARD PENALTIES:

- (a) Second cuts—one credit card in size (85 x 55 x 10mm) equals five penalty strokes.

  One penalty stroke—(85 x 11 x 10mm).
- (b) One penalty stroke for not breaking the neck wool on full wool fleeces.
- (c) One whole point per offence if pen handler lifts sheep to assist catch. (See <u>2</u>. (h)). To be imposed by the Board Referee in consultation with the Judge/s.
- (d) One penalty stroke per side for obvious belly wool or brisket frib not removed when shearing belly or for obvious fleece wool removed with belly.
- (e) One penalty stroke for not throwing the belly wool clear

### **SHEARING PENALTIES ....cont**

#### BOARD JUDGES.....cont.

- (e) **One penalty stroke** for not throwing the belly wool clear
- (f) One penalty stroke for wool thrown interfering with another competitor.
- (g) Two penalty strokes for first hind leg wool broken out deliberately by competitor on full wool sheep.
- (h) Three penalty strokes for using handpiece or blades to cut open neck wool unless a ruling allowing this is made by the Chief Referee.
- Five penalty strokes is a shorn sheep on release breaks up fleece or carries fleece wool out porthole.
- (j) Two whole points for allowing a shorn or partly shorn sheep to escape. The shearer must make a genuine effort to pen the sheep. Does not apply if sheep is properly penned and returns to shearing board.
- (k) One whole point per offence for work before or after time by competitor or pen handler (and during by pen handler) for plucking, removing tassels etc. (See <u>2.</u> (e),). To be imposed by the Board Referee in consultation with Judge/s.
- Five whole points be imposed for rough handling of sheep per offence, Judge and Board Referee's decision in consultation.
- (m) The Board Referee is to advise scorers of any whole point penalty under (7. (I)).

#### **SHEARING PENALTIES ....cont**

#### 8. THE PEN JUDGES:

- (a) Single judging system to be used. If possible, number of Judges used should divide equally into number of sheep being shorn.
- (b) The pen judges will judge sheep for-
  - (i) Wool left on
  - (ii) Cuts on Sheep
- (c) The Pen Judge must call the referee to decide penalty for 9. (b), then judge the rest of that sheep.

#### 9. PEN PENALTIES:

- (a) (i) Wool left on sheep—one credit card in size (85 x 55 x 10mm) - five penalty strokes.
   One penalty stroke—(85 x 11 x 10mm)
  - (ii) Skin Cuts—one penalty stroke per 15mm diameter in size, or an equivalent accumulation of smaller errors.
  - (iii) A cut into flesh or muscle (not serious enough to be a full penalty of five whole points) will incur a minimum of five penalty strokes plus the cut.
  - (iv) Up to two penalty strokes per individual sock left on or up to four penalty strokes if very woolly, as decided by committee and Chief Referee (See <u>5.</u> (d)).
- (b) Pen Referee must be consulted and a competitor will be penalized by the addition of five whole points per offence added to their calculated pen score if they:
  - (i) Cut a teat and impair the breeding ability of a ewe.
  - (ii) Severely cut any sheep to the extent that it requires surgical attention.

(Referee may require a minor cut to be stitched without imposing the above penalty)

#### 9. PEN PENALTIES...cont

- (c) Pen Referee must be consulted and a competitor will be penalized by the addition of ten whole points per offence added to their calculated pen score if they—
  - (i) Cut a hamstring
  - (ii) Cut into or through the centre of a pizzle.
- (A Pizzle graze may not necessarily incur a full penalty)
- (d) Pen Referee will decide and write a full point penalty in a circle on pen card and initial it.

#### **SHEARING POINTS CALCULATION**

<u>Time</u> One point for each 20 seconds. Multiply

minutes by 3. Divide seconds by 20.

Board Points: Divide each competitor's total board points

by number of sheep shorn.

Pen Points: Divide total penalties by number of sheep

shorn.

Add Time; Board and Pen Points together to decide competitors score. Competitor with lowest score wins.

Scores are to be alert for full point penalties on board and pen cards.

In the event of a tie, the competitor with the lowest score for board and pen will take precedence.

If there is still a tie, the competitor with the lower pen score will take precedence.

If there is still a tie, the competitor with the lower board score will take precedence.

#### **Qaulity Benchmark:**

A quality benchmark applies and will over **15** on the board and

- Over **15** for crossbred/strong wool sheep in the pen
- Over 25 for merino/fine wool sheep in the pen (The benchmark may be extended at the discretion of the Disputes Committee.)

Competitors with quality points exceeding the benchmark will be placed in ascending order <u>below</u> those competitors who do not exceed the benchmark. (NOVICE EXCLUDED)

Finalist to receive prize money, if over BQ.

#### 11. DISPUTES:

- (a) # Any disputes will taken to a Disputes Committee chaired by the Chief Referee. A written appeal must be lodged within 15 minutes of the scores being posted or announced after each event. Any resolved dispute must be forwarded in writing, first to the committee concerned and finally, if necessary to SSNZ National Committee.
- (b) # Person/s appealing may speak to their appeal before the Disputes Committee. Other persons will not enter discussion unless requested or invited to do so by Chief Referee.
- (c) # In all cases, and in any matters not covered by the rules, the decision of the Disputes Committee will be final and binding on all competitors.

#### 12. ADDITONAL RULES:

(a) # All competitions must be equipped with first aid kit, needle, thread and antiseptic and should have veterinary support available if possible.

#### ADDITIONAL RULES...cont

- b) # Where a prize is given for the best shorn pen of sheep then the pen must have been shorn within a reasonable time as decided by the Referee.
- (c) # Organizing committees should endeavor to provide a clock that is visible to competitors and spectators.
- (d) # Countries who have adopted the Golden Shears International Sheep Shearing Rules have the right to amend or introduce a rule in accordance with national Code of Practice or standards subject to World Council approval.
- (e) # Late entries maybe accepted at up to a surcharge of 50%

#### **COMPETITION RULES—WOOLHANDLING**

- 1. Woolhandlers are not permitted on the shearing board
- 2. No oddment piles are allowed on the board.
- All woolhandling finals must use competent resident shearers' (also for heats when possible) who must complete the event and stay on the assigned stand.
- In full wool competitions, there will no skirting of first pieces on the board

#### **WOOLHANDLING CONTESTS**

#### Note:

Where possible a standard board height from stage to floor of approximately 760 mm should be used. The board width should be a minimum of 1600 mm.

At the completion of shearing in all woolhandling events, down tubes are to be left hanging in their natural position.

#### WOOLHANDLING—WOOL LENGTH

Full Wool 10 months minimum 2nd Shear 4 months minimum 8 months maximum

#### WOOLHANDLING—OBJECTIVE JUDGING RULES

Credit Card (CC) = 1 penalty point
A4 (paper) Fleece Throw = 1 penalty point
Grid for 'Process judging' (Dimensions 10cm x 15cm)
Oddment Grid = 3 penalty points

### PROCESS (outside) Judging

#### **BLENDING RULE:**

That lambs wool and second shear wools are to be wellblended fleece into fleece. Blending will be judged once at the end prior to the competitor signaling time. A maximum of 20 points for no blend.

#### **WOOLHANDLING TIME POINTS**

Time penalties will be calculated at the rate of 5 seconds per point to the following standard times. The standard time will be set at the referees/committees discretion.

#### **Merino Wool:**

- 1 Shearer within the range of 3 to 3.30 minutes
- 2 Shearer's up to 25% more of time set.

#### Mid Micron and Crossbred Full Wool

- 1 Shearer within the range of 2 to 2.30 minutes
- 2 Shearer's up to 25% more of time set.

#### **WOOLHANDLING TIME POINTS .... cont**

#### 2nd Shear and Lambs

• Between the range of 40 seconds to 1 minute.

Competitors exceeding the standard time limit will be penalised at the rate of 1 point per second thereafter.

#### **TEAM EVENTS**

- A team will consist of two shearer's and two woolhandler's
- Each team to shear and handle the wool from a minimum of six sheep.
- Shearer's are not allowed to assist the woolhandler's with woolhandling.
- Woolhandler's can assist each other on the board or table when time permits.
- 5. Shearer's may shear an uneven number of sheep.

#### **TEAM POINTS**

#### Shearer;s Points:

Shall be left as actual penalty points and not divided by the number of sheep shorn.

#### Woolhandler's Points:

Board, oddments and fleece points will be added together, then divide by 2.5.

#### Time:

One time will be taken for each team—from shearer starting on 'GO' until the Woolhandler raises either hand or broom at the rate of 10 sec/point.

#### NOTE:

There will be occasions where the level of fault present in the wool means the woolhandler's points will be too high in relation to the shearer and time points. The woolhandling referee has the right to adjust the dividing factor on the woolhandler's points to a figure higher than 2.5. This figure should rarely exceed 4.0.

#### **WOOL PRESSING COMPETITIONS**

Competitors will be judged on their wool pressing skills in the

following categories.

#### 1. Setting up the Press:

Inserting pins

Checking wool pack for loose fibre

Fitting wool pack into press

Team work

Use of safety catches (door, top box, winch and press handle).

#### 2. Loading press with wool

Tramping technique

Loading wool into press, lifting technique, efficiency and tidiness

Bales should be tramped to ensure bottom box is heavier than top box

Placing lid into position on top box (lid must not be above walls of top box)

#### 3. Pressing bale (pulling the loaded press down)

Lifting and lowering top box into position, use of safety catches and lifting technique

Removal of pins from top box

Fitting pull down bars to lid and connecting ropes to capstan

Pressing technique while pulling the press down Inserting side pinning assemblies. Handle taken off when pressing bale

Releasing the press and removing the lid, technique and safety

Removing ropes from capstan.

#### **WOOL PRESSING...cont**

#### 4. Capping off the bale

Amount of wool exposed above pins

Folding flaps into position, removal and replacement of pack holders

Inserting bale clips, top and bottom flaps

Flaps must overlap 100mm

Position and spacing of bale clips

Correct use of bale hook

Remove side pinners, storing handle

Removing bale from press

Opening door: lifting & bale handling technique;

closing press door, refitting safety catch

#### 5. Completed bale

Overall tidiness

Amount of wool exposed from top or corners of bale Top corners of flaps should fit snugly over bottom flaps

Bottom corners should be equally firm Bale should stand square on floor

#### 6. Farm brand and bale description

Competitors must show where the farm brand, bale number and wool description should be placed Describe the wool category, i.e fleece, second shear, 1st lambs etc as well as know the standard industry description (FLC, 2/S, 1ST LBS). (The bale description should be written on the judges score sheet by the competitors).

#### 7. Final clean up and tidiness

The floor area around the press and wool bins must be clean and tidy

Press pins should be relocated into bottom of top box

Press ropes should be folded/coiled neatly on the floor beside pull down bars

Pack holders should be replaced in position

#### 8. Bale Weight

Competitors will be advised the target bale weight by supervising judge

Competitors are not allowed to see bale weights until heats are completed. Penalties will be 1 point for each kg plus or minus 15kg from target weight, and 2 points for weights over 15kg from target weight.

#### 9. Time Points

Time points will be calculated at one point every 10 seconds

#### 10. Personal Safety

Judges will penalise careless workmanship and rough use of equipment and facilities in the interests of safety.

- The challenger must accept full responsibility for all travel and accommodation costs for its own team members.
- The defender shall provide a four stand venue and all officials necessary for the challenge, as well as adult sheep of one breed.
- The defender and challenger must take into account due respect for the Tru Test Ltd / Supershear brand when organising any sponsorship for the challenge.
- The teams will consist of 1 open and 1 senior shearer 1 open and 1 junior woolhandler.
- 8. The challenging team can have one shearing judge and one woolhandling judge at the invitation of the defenders.
- All team members including judges must have been permanent residents in their region for at least the past 12 months prior to the date of the challenge to be eligible for team selection. The regions are those as set out in the Directory.
- 10. Individual team members can be replaced or changed during the year and from challenge to challenge. However teams must be named at least 14 days prior to a challenge.

- Recommended sheep numbers: Maximum Open 10 sheep / senior 8 sheep. Minimum Open 6 / senior 4 or as appropriate.
- 12. SSNZ rules to apply.
- 13. Challenges must be received prior to 1 Sept by the Regional Delegate of the defending region.
- 14. Should the trophy be uplifted at any stage the remaining number of challenges available can be reapplied for by giving two weeks notice to the new defender. All previously accepted challenges shall have first option.
- 15. Should any one region have the trophy uninterrupted for three years, then that region must have two away challenges next year at its expense.
- 16. The region holding the trophy at year end, shall be the region recorded by way of a shield on the trophy. However if a region has been successful for one challenge during a year and loses the trophy, that region will also be recorded by way of a shield on the trophy box for that year.
- 17. There is to be no prize money for any team members however sponsorship to cover cost is allowable.

All disputes to these rules to be referred to the Chairman of a subcommittee appointed by SSNZ.



- Application for membership must be in writing. Membership entitles organisation to SSNZ benefits.
- Affiliation levy is \$3.00+GST per competitor with a minimum fee of \$40.00+GST payable to: The Secretary,
  - 392 Purchas Rd, RD 2, Amberley 7482
- Affiliated Speed Shears must use registered SSNZ judges. SSNZ judges are permitted to judge at non-affiliated Speed Shears, but should encourage them to be affiliated to SSNZ.
- Judges and officials have the right to refuse a competitor, if it is considered their ability is impaired by alcohol or drugs.
- Open and Senior grade Speed Shears only. If a Speed Shear wishes to involve Junior and Intermediate grades, it must be a clean shear event.
- SSNZ Health & Safety policy will apply to Speed Shear events.
- In fairness to competitors every effort should be made to get lambs/sheep as even as possible.

#### **SPEED SHEAR RULES:**

- Sheep to be judged standing (unless an obvious misdemeanor underneath) to a pen score of 12 and under. Above 12 is a red light.
- 2. Plucking after time will mean disqualification.
- 3. Time to be taken from cord pull to cord pull if electronic timing is not available
- 4. No false starts (applicable to timing system only)
- 5. Moccasins or suitable footwear must be worn
- 6. Full pizzle, teat and tail crutch is essential.
- Public Liability—all competitions are urged to check their Public Liability and Cover.

# CHECKLIST FOR SHEARING & WOOLHANDLING COMMITTEES:

As a quick guide here is a checklist of the people and roles important for a smooth running competition:

- Chairman responsible for coordination, program, presentations and gathering together a good team.
- Secretary: Entries, results to Doug, cash prizes, judging stationary, judges etc.
- ⇒ Publicity Officer: Doug! Use him, he's great value.
- Sheep Steward: responsible for securing the sheep, good preparation and selection for finals. Transport, unloading and loading, and any animal welfare issues.
- Sheep Steward: responsible for securing the sheep, good preparation and selection for finals. Transport, unloading and loading and any animal welfare issues.
- Pen Steward: to ensure enough pen staff for the stock movement of shorn & woolly sheep—works closely with the sheep steward.
- Wool Steward: ring the wool examiner for help here wool containers, wool movers, stop watches. Pressing requirements with fadges, clips etc. A good wool
- judging area with tables and fadge holders. Press and presser.
- Points Person: very important, computer generated results are always the best, but so are accurate manual points people. Copies of points for the finalists are always appreciated.
- Presentation Steward: someone who knows what all goes together such as product, cash and ribbons—not an easy job. Nice to have a well laid table and a prepared presentation steward to ensure the presentation goes off well.

#### Committee Checklist....cont

- Catering: nothing goes well without good food for the hard working crew. This includes cold drinks for those hot day.
- Draws Steward: This person will ensure the draws are made in a timely manner and will then attend to the blackboards with names clearly and correctly written.
- Commentator: someone to ensure the day moves along and can keep the layperson informed as to what is going on. Also important in keeping our sponsors in front of the people.
- Disputes Committee: not often this is needed, but you do need to be aware of who forms the make up of this body (Shearer / Woolhandler Rep).
- One last tip, it's always helpful if the committee are conversant with the Directory—90% of the answers are at your fingertips, if not give you Regional Delegate a call, only to pleased to offer support.
- All A-grade Crossbred open shearing shows to run 10 sheep semi-final and other shows to run a minimum of 8 sheep semi-final where practical.

#### **PROGRAMME TIPS:**

A professional image and presentation is important for the survival of our sport. Plan you competition with careful attention to detail so that you start on time and stay on time.

Understand that finals are the finale for the day, they deserve to be in prime time, think about the best timing for these events

A sponsor who can appear in front of an enthusiastic crowd, will definitely want to be there again next year.

#### So our hot tips are:

- ⇒ Have a timetable, and be committed to sticking with it.
- ⇒ Promote your show at preceding shows, especially the start time.
- ⇒ Organise to have plenty of help.
- ⇒ It's not your fault if people are late—the late junior shearer will just have to shear in the intermediate class!
- ⇒ Aim to run the major finals at prime time 3pm-4pm. This is just before people start leaving for home.
- ⇒ Schedule events to minimize delays.
- ⇒ Keep the pace 'hot', a good commentator can help this.
- ⇒ Be just as careful in your planning for the prize giving as for the actual shearing and woolhandling events. A lack of planning at the prize giving can cancel all the good work early on.
- ⇒ Public Liability all competitions are urged to check their public liability responsibilities and cover.

SSNZ encourages all show committees to promote their events through the media, if this is an issue, let Doug help you. Often a good idea to have someone who has this as a dedicated responsibility.

Finally, please remember to get those results to Doug asap, after your competition.
